Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

We are delighted to announce the amalgamation of the PTAs of Stepping Stones and Elburton Primary School. The two settings officially joined in 2016 and as such Elburton Primary now welcomes children from 2-11 years. Over the past 3 years we have developed a very close relationship between the staff in Foundation and the pre-school leaders, working together on the Early Years curriculum.

The location of the pre-school moved from Elburton village hall into the former caretaker's house on the grounds in 2008 and since then the children have been able to visit the school premises during their pre-school sessions and have benefited from working closely with the school.

Although parents of rising 5's still need to apply through Admissions at Plymouth City Council for a place in Foundation with the same requirements, we have been able to ensure a smooth transition for those children who choose Elburton Primary as their school choice.

With joining of the PTAs, the committee will now support the 2-4 year olds in the same way as it does with children in Foundation to Year 6. Stepping Stones will join with the school fairs and fundraising events and we look forward to the future as one school.



Website developments

As some of you super observant parents and friends will have noticed we have updated the structure of the school website. We felt that it was not easy to navigate and find the useful information that you need about the school.

In light of this, it has changed structure considerably. Please take a look and let us know your thoughts. There are some sections that are in the process of being populated and updated in line with key developments in the school at the moment.

The curriculum section, is empty at the moment, as we are updating the key documents. As we move towards the end of term and into the spring term, you will find a great deal of useful information in these sections about the curriculum at the school.

The Elburton Book Swap Box

Have you got books at home that your child has outgrown? Are they much-loved books that another child would enjoy? If the answer is yes, we would like your help as we are looking to set up a book swap box in the school reception. This is where children add a book that they have enjoyed but no longer want and swap it for a book that they wish to read. There is no need to return the book like you would with a library; however, books can be swapped again so that their enjoyment continues.

Initially, we are looking for good quality book donations in three categories: Key Stage 1 books (including picture books), Year 3 and 4 books and Year 5 and 6 books. These books can be handed into Mrs Barrett or Miss Fraser at the office.

Once we have a few books in our box, we will open the box for swaps. These swaps can take place before or after school as the box will always be open in our entrance area. Watch this space for further details!
