EYFS 1	KEY CONCEPTS HISTORY (UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD – PEOPLE AND COMMUNITIES)			
	Children in Pre School begin to learn the concept of history as they develop an awareness of past events in their own lives. In Term 1 during their 'My Fantastic Family?' topic, they remember special events such as their birthday or family events which they talk about with their peers. They will have the opportunity to talk about their own memories and share pictures from home. The children are encouraged to talk about members of their immediate family and their relationship to them. Children will have the opportunity to listen to the differences in their own and other's lives and begin to make comparisons with their peers. During Term 3 they will be introduced to different occupations during the theme 'Let's Go'. During this theme, they will compare different occupations and think about what the jobs entail. They will make comparisons of different people and look at the positives in being different.			
EYFS 2	KEY CONCEPTS HISTORY (UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD – PEOPLE AND COMMUNITIES)			
	Children in our Reception classes begin to learn the concept of history as they develop an awareness of past events in their own lives. In Term 1 during their 'Who am I?' topic, they remember special events such as their birthdays and other family events. The children are encouraged to talk about members of their immediate family and their relationship to them. In Term 2 as part of their 'Blast Off' topic, they learn about significant figures in history such as Neil Armstrong and watch historic videos of the moon landings. Throughout Terms 4 and 5, children are introduced to the concept of a timeline as look closely at how things change over time including, plants, animals and the chronology of their own lives when they look closely at how they have changed since they were born. As the children near the end of their time in Foundation, there are many opportunities for reflection. The children become aware of the changes that they have gone through over the course of their time in school and how they have changed since they were a baby. Children are introduced to a range of stories which promote discussions such as how clothes and toys have changed over time. Children talk to the older generation to find out about what it was like when they were a child.
