South Africa Visit

Since our last newsletter Miss Collinson, myself and 8 other people from Horizon MAT schools have visited our link school in Cape Town, South Africa. We spent the half term week in Cape Town in a very full week, at Bergvliet Community Primary School. While in the school we both spoke to the whole school in an assembly and worked with individual classes. We found out about the work they are doing on recycling, reducing and reusing items in our drive to reduce the use of plastics and protect our environment. They have a school recycling system, where the community bring their recyclable rubbish to the school to dispose of it, this brings an income to the school. We also saw how the children are making eco-bricks and how they are using them. During the week, we were able to share the learning from our Year 2 classes with them. Mr Paulse, the Headteacher will be visiting us in June as part of our ongoing link. This development and partnership work would not be possible without funding and support of Connecting Classrooms through The British Council. It is an outstanding initiative that brings our classrooms and children, wherever they are, together across the world.



British Council Visit

Yesterday we were able to welcome Mr John Rolfe MBE, from The British Council to Elburton. The aim of his visit was to explore the International Schools work we are committed to at Elburton. It was wonderful for him to be able to talk to the children in Year 2, about their South Africa link project and talk to our staff who have benefitted from these overseas opportunities.

On Friday the 28th of February, Elburton Primary School's talented athletics squad excitedly left for Plymouth Life Centre where they would be competing in the prestigious Level 3 Devon Indoor Athletics Festival; the months of hard-work were paying off.



A few months ago, they had been to Plymstock School where they had competed in their first athletics competition beating 3 other schools to grab the Plymstock gold medal and a place in the Plymouth Athletics Competition (the next stage in their competition run by PSSP). This event was held at Marjons Sports Hall. The team performed fantastically; however, some slight hiccups resulted in them coming second by 14 points, losing to our rivals, Bickleigh Down. Even after they had had a stunning performance, the team knew that getting a pole position against the 14 best schools in Devon would be tough. mined to give them the best chance so they took every opportunity, every assembly and every PE session (when it wasn't raining – which wasn't as often as they'd like!), to practise their events.



These events included - our 6 relay events (1x1, 2x2, 4x1, 6x2, obstacle relay and over and under), javelin, speed bounce, chest push, standing long jump, triple jump and vertical jump.

The Elburton squad included Sienna, Beth, Erin, Annabelle, Darcie, Scarlett, Roman, Josh, Tobi, Joel, Thomas and Ethan. Our talented team came

3rd out of all the schools in Devon. Wow! What an incredible achievement for all of the children that took part.

We are immensely proud of this team and hope next year's team will keep up the reputation.

Emotional Logic Training for Year 5 and Year 6 parents

4th May 2020 - 3.40pm - 5pm in the school hall

This training is part of the direct work taking place with our Year 6 children as part of their PSHRE curriculum (Personal, Health, Social and Relationships Education).

What is Emotional Logic?

Emotional Logic was developed in a healthcare setting during the late 1990s. The method is now used in welfare settings, schools, inclusion units, parenting and youth support organisations, care support and for people with learning or communication difficulties.

Emotional Logic is a structured way to understand the useful purposes of emotions and the ability to turn unpleasant emotions into positive action whilst limiting distress and confusion. This life-long learning method leads to emotional strength and resilience in the face of life's challenges. In turn, this gives the foundation for positive character development.

Adjusting to change is an emotional process and can be difficult. Emotional Logic is used by many counsellors and therapists. This course will NOT be counselling or therapy but will help you in your everyday conversations, parenting and teaching.

Emotions are all useful as we adjust, even if they don't feel great. They are not just in the mind; they are chemistry, thoughts, feelings, posture and facial expressions all rolled in together as you prepare for change. In the training and materials, we explore the seven emotions related to change especially when it involves loss. These are called stepping stones and they are triggered whenever something we value is lost or at risk of being lost. This may be very intense, as in bereavement, or fleeting when experiencing the smallest loss. Even these small losses can trigger a very big loss reaction in children and adults alike. Emotional Logic equips the learners with a tool kit to support emotions and lead to emotional development. Consequently, this method is effective in helping people to cope better with day to day setbacks and disappointments.

The Emotional Logic Centre is working in partnership with MAST (Multi-Agency-Support-Team) and Elburton Primary School.

If you would like to attend and are a parent of a child in Year 5 and Year 6, please come and train with our school staff. To register your interest, please log onto your ParentPay account to confirm your attendance and let us know how many seats you require.

There will be a crèche facility in the Year 2 classrooms for Primary School aged children.
