## Children's entry to school

We really need your support.... as a school team we are having a real focus on developing our children's independence, developing their skills to regulate their own behaviours and developing smooth transitions. This also links directly with ensuring our morning sessions start smoothly and that our staff can focus on the children immediately.

One of the key actions we have, is for the teachers to meet the children at the classroom door, to welcome them into class, so that we have immediate contact with every child before learning starts. If the teachers are talking to other adults this cannot happen as effectively as it should.

Please can you support us by encouraging your children to come into school independently, they have done this brilliantly since Foundation and really are experts.

If you have a query, concern or something that the teacher needs to be aware of, please let the office know, who will be only too pleased to pass this on. You can also email your teachers directly, it that is easier. After school, is generally a much better time to see the team.

Linked to this, it is vital that we know who is in the school building during school hours. People who are in the building must all have ID or a visitor badge at these times - this is to keep everyone safe. Thank you for your support with this.

#### Year 6 Bikeability 13th - 17th October 2019

This week, Year 6 have been participating in the Bikeability cycle training programme. They have been learning practical skills and understanding how to cycle safely on today's roads.




On Day 1, the children started the session on the playground in order to work towards their Bikeability Level 1. This is a course which aims to develop mastery in cycle handling in an off-road environment and prepare riders for cycling on the road safely. Everyone got involved and had a great time – some of the children even learned to ride a bike for the first time!

Throughout the next three days of the week, the children worked on their Bikeability Level 2 course which is a certification aimed at developing riders' skills and confidence for cycling on single-lane roads and simple

junctions in and around the Elburton area – you may have even seen them out and about during the week!

If children were struggling to ride a bike, they were lucky enough to have enough instructors to help them learn to be even more confident on their bikes throughout the







## Bikeability Balance Foundation 7th - 9th October 2019

Our Foundation children have been very lucky to have had the expert tuition from Plymouth School Sports Partnership. Over the three days all children in Foundation completed the Balanceability course. Bikeability Balance is a programme aimed at 4 - 6 year olds with the intention of them riding a pedal bike by the end of the course.

Initially, the children focussed on a range of balancing activities; standing on one leg and balancing on stepping stones. Then they learned how to mount and move safely on a balance bike. As their confidence grew, they were able to glide on the balance bikes, whilst imagining that they needed to keep their feet out of the water in case the crocodile nibbled their toes. On the final day, all children progressed to a pedal bike. The progress that all children made was incredible with many confident to ride without the support of an adult next to them. We have all been excited to see the photos and videos that are being sent into school via the children's online learning journals, Tapestry. This has enabled the children to show their classmates them enjoying riding on their bikes in different parts of the city.
