SECTION 1: Overview

We are firmly committed to ensuring pupils can participate in purposeful physical education and physical activity at this time. Schools have the flexibility to decide how physical education, sport and physical activity will be provided whilst following the measures in their system of controls. The Government guidance for full opening states that schools are able to work with external coaches, clubs and organisations for curricular and extracurricular activities where they are satisfied that it is safe to do so. We are dedicated to ensuring that all staff and students are protected, feel safe and have access to the most up to date guidance.

Teaching physical education in the current environment will be adaptable and imaginative and will take place in accordance to the latest Government guidance and advice. COVID-19 is a virus that puts the physically vulnerable at risk and attacks the airway and respiratory system, which is why the upkeep and maintenance of activity that promotes respiratory health, weight management and physical health is essential. Through adaptation we believe meaningful work and high quality teaching and learning can take place.

Sports whose national governing bodies have developed guidance under the principles of the Government's guidance on team sport and been approved by the Government are permitted. The PSSP will only provide team sports on the list available at return to recreational team sport framework. Pupils should be kept in consistent groups, sports equipment thoroughly cleaned between each use by different individual groups, and contact sports avoided.

Outdoor sports should be prioritised where possible, and large indoor spaces used where it is not, maximising natural ventilation flows (through opening windows and doors or using air conditioning systems wherever possible) distancing between pupils and paying scrupulous attention to cleaning and hygiene. This is particularly important in a sports setting because of the way in which people breathe during exercise. External facilities can also be used in line with Government guidance for the use of, and travel to and from, those facilities.

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PSSP Staff Deployment - PSSP staff will comply with the school's arrangements for managing and minimising risk, including taking particular care to maintain distance from other staff and pupils when delivering in PSSP schools. The PSSP ask that all schools share any written material they have for their Covid-19 protocols so that PSSP staff can work in accordance with these and in addition the following controls have been put in place:
